Groundcover and Soils Ecologist

Christine has a wealth of experience working with innovative landholders to implement regenerative land management practices that enhance biodiversity, increase biological activity, sequester carbon, activate soil nutrient cycles, restore water balance, improve productivity and create new topsoil.

Colin Seis (Gulgong, NSW)
Co-founder of "Pasture Cropping"

"Pasture Cropping" is a land management method where grazing and cropping are combined into a single technique where each benefits the other. Crops are zero till sown into living, dormant, perennial grass species which result in good crop yields, increased grazing, lower costs and vast improvements in perennial grass recruitment and diversity.

Malcolm Plum (Tarcutta, NSW)
Local Producer "Healthy Soils"

Southern NSW farmers Malcolm and Kerrie Plum have noticed a dramatic improvement in the health of their livestock since they began adopting biological farming techniques over 15 years ago. Previous animal health problems – including bloat, grass tetany and milk fever in cattle and lambing sickness in sheep – have all but been eliminated with the use of "biologically-active" fertilisers that have added new life to their soils.

Ian & Di Haggerty (Wyalcatchem, WA)
Broadacre Farming Biologically

Di, Ian and sons farm approx 6,800ha with 3,600ha of crops and approx 3,000 head of sheep. The Haggerty's have been practising biological farming for ten years over a variety of soil types and rainfall zones.

"We practice biological farming methods, utilising soil friendly fertilisers to support and encourage biodiversity in soil life, resulting in excellent feed quality for our livestock. We believe that building soil health = plant health = animal health, and ultimately human health, in the way nature intended".

Enhancing the Carbon Flow...teaser...

Excerpt from one of Christine's recent papers:
Soil carbon and soil nitrogen:

Aside from water, nitrogen is frequently the most limiting factor to crop and pasture production. It is one of the great ironies of agriculture that the atmosphere is around 78% nitrogen, but not one single molecule is directly available to plants. There are approximately 78,000 tonnes of N sitting above every hectare of land. Apart from small accessions via lightning, nitrogen cannot be accessed without a microbial bridge.

Nitrogen-fixing bacteria - be they free-living in the rhizosphere, confined to nodules on plant roots, or existing as endophytes in leaves or stems - derive their energy from liquid carbon fixed during photosynthesis.

"Soil carbon - can it save agricultures bacon?"

"I believe NutriSoil increases photosynthetic rate, hence glucose formation and liquid carbon flow to soil, stimulating microbial activity and mineral uptake. In the process the exuded carbon also builds new topsoil, restoring soil structure and function."

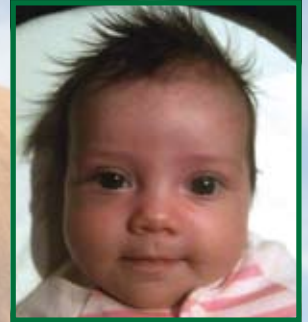
